### **ASABE Completes Revision to Agricultural Equipment Speed Identification Symbol Standard**

ST JOSEPH, MICHIGAN— The American Society of Agricultural and Biological Engineers (ASABE) announces the completion of a revision to the agricultural equipment speed identification symbol standard.

The revised standard, ANSI/ASAE S584.2, Agricultural Equipment: Speed Identification Symbol (SIS), corrects outdated references that were noted in the most recent periodic review of the document. No other sections in the standard were changed by this revision. The standard was originally adopted by ASABE in January of 2005.
